

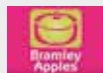

In the Minster there will be over twenty food and drink stands in the Nave, featuring some of the best rural small producers and retailers, where you will be able to view, taste and buy local foods such as apple pancakes, apple butters and jellies, a wide range of cakes and pastries, sweets and chocolates, honey products, W.I apple pies, jams and pickles, pork products, cheeses, apple drinks, cordials, ceramics, cookery books and magazines and even popcorn! There will also be a large display of different varieties of apples from John Hemsall's Heritage Orchard and apple related children's craft, cookery and story telling activities.

Cookery Demonstrations

If you are not quite sure what to cook or just looking for a little inspiration or some quick recipe ideas and tips, then come along to the cookery demonstration area and watch a little creative cooking using local food products.
