Southwell Noticeboards May 11 2022

At previous meetings of the Town Environment Committee we agreed a plan to restore and develop the noticeboards in the town.

Update

The community notice board outside the Wheatsheaf has been renovated by staff and is now well used by the community. The surface [used elsewhere] is more robust than cork and is holding up well. Similarly, the community board in Church Street car park was moved closer to thicket machine, restored as above and is being used. The King Street car park has been renovated and updated. This cannot be changed regularly as the front is screwed in. It will be updated annually. The Westhorpe board has been restored, and its doors closing, also in use by the community. The notice board used for town events, managed by the staff, outside the Library is to be restored and this is being funded by the NCC's LIS funding that has already been achieved.

It is proposed that

- the noticeboard at the entrance to the Church St and then in the Co-op carparks have had their
 previous boards removed. It is proposed that these are renovated with map of the town, currently
 being drawn by the Council to be included in the A3 Visit Southwell leaflet. The board frames will be
 painted and the waterproofed maps installed on both. This will be undertaken by staff after mowing in
 2022 has been completed.
- 2. the boards in Normanton and Leeway Road will be restored after this in 2023.
- 3. the board at the Admiral Rodney is no longer needed or easily read so be removed and parts reused if possible.
- 4. the staff review the use of the community boards on a monthly basis to ensure validity
